SPOKEN IN HONOR OF JOSÉ MARÍA ABASCAL ON THE OCCASION OF
THE ITA ADVISORY BOARD MEETING AT THE 2012 ITA WORKSHOP,
ON THE 21ST OF JUNE

In the summer of 1996, I found myself on a road on the grounds of the United Nations in Geneva. It was a warm, sunny, summer day; I was lost.

I had been appointed as a Commissioner to the United Nations Compensation Commission (UNCC) and was there looking for the building in which we were to have our first meeting. I did not know that it was one of those days of good fortune in life, for along the road came a man who knew where the building was. He was my co-panelist and would become a dear friend: José María Abascal

José is a great human being. He has the spirit to appreciate fine music and to be moved by great literature.
